European Lacewood.

The name given to Quarter sawn and ray figured timber from the London Plane tree. Lacewood displays a bold ray figure that has a lacey appearance. Colour is a mixture of pink and orange brown. The tree is a cross between American Sycamore and Oriental Plane, first discovered in the 17th Century and widely planted in the 18th Century in London and other urban areas, as it copes well with smoke polluted atmospheres. Uses include cabinetry and furniture especially in veneer form.
